

HE LORAIN COUNTY **M** ETROPOLITAN PARK DISTRICT was established in 1957 by the Lorain County Probate Court. Under the provisions of Chapter 1545 of the Ohio Revised Code, Lorain County Metro Parks is a special district operating as a separate political subdivision of the State of Ohio. The Metro Parks provide residents with the preservation of open space, education conservation. and outdoor recreation programs and facilities.

Parks is provided primarily by a 1.3 mill countywide property tax levy. Other sources of income include grants, gifts and bequests along with fees generated from the Forest Hills Golf Course, Splash Zone, Miller Nature Preserve, Mercy Health & Recreation Centerand facility rentals.



# LORAIN COUNTY METRO PARKS BOARD OF PARK COMMISSIONERS

Lorain County Metro Parks is governed by a three-member Board of Park Commissioners, who are appointed by the Lorain County Probate Court Judge and serve without pay.

The Board of Park Commissioners is responsible for policy and decision making. The Director/Secretary is responsible for the daily management of the Metro Parks. The Lorain County Metro Parks staff is comprised of 68 full-time and 10 year-round, part-time employees, supplemented by up to 160 seasonal staff members in the summer months. Fourteen members of the Metro Parks' ranger staff are certified Ohio Peace Officers. The rangers are responsible for public safety in the Metro Parks and are also assigned park maintenance and supervisory duties. Other staff members maintain ties and conduct educational programming and special event activities in the park district.

# LORAIN COUNTY METRO PARKS DISTRICT 2013 ACCOMPLISHMENTS



### MERCY HEALTH & RECREATION CENTER





In February, Lorain County Metro Parks opened Mercy Health & Recreation Center. Located off Cooper Foster Park Road in Amherst, the project represents a partnership between the park district and Mercy Hospital. The 50,000 square foot facility is home to the hospital's physical, speech and occupational services, while the recreation center features an eight-lane swimming pool, therapy pool, cardio and circuit fitness area, walking track, cycling room, three aerobics rooms and locker rooms. The project was made possible through the generous land donations of the Hollstein and Campana families.

# THE INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND AT HOLLSTEIN RESERVATION



The Inclusive Playground at Hollstein Reservation officially opened in July. The playground was created in conjunction with The Lorain County Department of Developmental Disabilities, Murray Ridge Center and several families that have children impacted by a disability. The playground includes 17 play spaces featuring nature play, structured play and aquatics play, for children of all abilities. In its first year the playground had more than 4,000 visitors.





## TRAIL DEVELOPMENT

### MILLER NATURE Preserve New Trail

A half mile long gravel trail was constructed and opened in 2013 at Miller Nature Preserve. The six foot wide trail offers a relaxing hike through forested wetland and over a small footbridge before it connects with the Arbor Acres subdivision. The trail provides great access to Miller Nature Preserve for the local schools and residents.



#### SAUTER PROPERTY

In the fall of 2013, eighty seven acres of land was purchased on the border of LaGrange and Grafton Townships with the help of the Clean Ohio Fund and the Western Reserve Land Conservancy. Known as the Sauter property, this land resides along the East Branch of the Black River and hosts a diverse landscape including farmland, forest, floodplain and wetlands.



#### BRIDGEWAY TRAIL EXTENSION

The most recent phase of the Black River Bikeway has been completed which connects the trailhead of the North Coast Inland Trail on Gateway Boulevard to the Elyria Police Station near Cascade Park. The one mile multi-use path is part of a federally funded regional bikeway plan that will connect the City of Lorain to the North Coast Inland Trail in the City of Elyria,

and ultimately westward to the City of Toledo.



#### ARTS IN THE PARK SERIES

Lorain County Metro Parks expanded its musical offerings in 2013 with the Arts in the Park series. The series added Miller Nature Preserve and French Creek Nature & Arts Center to the district's many outdoor concert venues. Music Under the Stars and the Sunset Concert Series continued at Lakeview Park along with the Summer Concert Series at Mill Hollow entertaining thousands of Lorain County residents.







### New Disc Golf Course

district's newest park recreational opportunity came in the form of disc golf. A 9-hole disc golf course was installed in the Bacon Woods area of Vermilion River Reservation. Spanning open fields, along ponds and through tall grass, the players enjoy a wide array of scenic and challenging terrain.



#### SPLASH ZONE POOL DECK REFINISHING

In its 11th year, the Splash Zone indoor pool was in need of a face

> lift. The park district invested in a new. anti-slip surface for the pool deck. The remodel shut down the pool for about 6 weeks, but the outcome was well worth the wait. The project is the first of more to come for Splash Zone.



#### TRUENORTH PERFORMANCES

The 2013 theatre season, in collaboration with TrueNorth Cultural Arts, was record-breaking with several sold out performances. Productions included the hits Miracle Worker, West Side Story, Happy Days, Man of La Mancha and Shrek, The Musical. Nearly 10,000 people visited French Creek Nature & Arts Center for the

#### CASCADE PARK




#### ABOUT THIS PUBLICATION
