



ABOUT THE PARK DISTRICT





The Lorain County Metropolitan Park District was established in 1957 by the Lorain County Probate Court. Under the provisions of Chapter 1545 of the Ohio Revised Code, Lorain County Metro Parks is a special district operating as a separate political subdivision of the State of Ohio. The Metro Parks provide residents with the preservation of open space, conservation, education and outdoor recreation programs and facilities.

Funding for the Metro Parks is provided primarily by a 1.3 mill countywide property tax levy. Other sources of income include grants, gifts and bequests along with fees generated from the Forest Hills Golf Course, Splash Zone, Miller Nature Preserve, Mercy Health & Recreation Center and facility rentals.

Lorain County Metro Parks is governed by a three-member Board of Park Commissioners, who are appointed by the Lorain County Probate Court Judge and serve without pay.

The Board of Park Commissioners is responsible for policy and decision making. The Director/Secretary is responsible for the daily management of the Metro Parks. The Lorain County Metro Parks staff is comprised of 64 full-time and 14 year-round, part-time employees, supplemented by up to 170 seasonal staff members in the summer months. Fourteen members of the Metro Parks' ranger staff are certified Ohio Peace Officers. The rangers are responsible for public safety in the Metro Parks and are also assigned park maintenance and supervisory duties. Other staff members maintain ties and conduct educational programming and special event activities in the park district.

Volunteer Support is an essential element to the success of the Metro Parks. Over the past year, volunteers donated over 25,000 hours of their time to the Metro Parks. Friends of Metro Parks in Lorain County Inc. now totals over 450 members.

2015 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

BLACK RIVER BIKEWAY

The Black River Bikeway was completed which breeds connectivity throughout the park district. The bikeway travels along West River Road beginning at the entrance of Cascade Park. The path then travels along Ford Road, thus connecting Cascade Park and the High Meadows entrance of the Black River Reservation.

ROYAL OAKS TRAIL OPENS FITNESS TRAIL OPENS · CLUBHOUSE RENOVATED

The former Royal Oaks Golf Course was acquired at the end of 2014. This section of Indian Hollow Reservation was opened to the public in September, 2015. This beautiful park includes a fitness trail along the 2.5 mile trail that features 15 different workout stations. The Clubhouse was also renovated and is open for rent by the public.





FRENCH CREEK RENOVATED

The French Creek Nature & Arts center underwent some renovations this past year. The children's play space inside the building was newly renovated. The kiva in the main lobby was also renovated with new carpeting and an HD TV.

NEW RESTROOM AT KOPF RESERVATION



A new restroom was built at the north end of the trail at Kopf Family Reservation and is open to the public.

WELLINGTON RESERVATION UPGRADES

Wellington Reservation saw two upgrades in facilities this past year. First, the visitor center was equipped with a beautiful new pergola at the entrance of the visitor's center. Secondly, the reservoir added a new, easy-to-use kayak launch.

In December, the Lorain County Metro Parks went live with an Eagle Cam of the ever-popular pair of Eagles that have set up a nest at Sandy Ridge Reservation. There has been a pair of eagles nesting at Sandy Ridge since 2002 so this past year, a web cam was set up to be able to watch these beautiful creatures build and maintain their nest.



CASCADE PARK OPERATION

On January 1, 2015 the Lorain County Metro Parks assumed operation of Cascade /Elywoods Park. Public meetings were held for input during the development of the master plan, which was ultimately unveiled to the public later in the year.



LAKEVIEW PARK UPGRADES



A new retaining wall was built at Lakeview Park as well as upgraded lights along the walkway. A new set of bike racks were also installed and were designed to look like roses to match the park's Rose Garden.

METRO PARK APPAREL

A brand new apparel line was rolled out in December. Customers can now purchase any of the more than 4 different T-shirt designs in a number of colors. A hoodie is also available for purchase. They are available in person at 3 different park facilities or at the online store.







TRUENORTH THEATRE

This season, theatre-goers were entertained by such notable works as *White Christmas*, *Jesus Christ Superstar* and the summer theatre camp production of *Back to the 80's: the Totally Awesome Musical* and many others. More than 6,000 tickets were sold for the Main Stage theatre season.

PADDLE & PEDAL FEST

This year, the annual Kayak Symposium at Lakeview Park integrated a bicycle portion and re-branded itself as the "Paddle & Pedal Fest." Not only did participants get to learn and practice in the water on kayaks, canoes and standup paddleboards, but they also learned bicycle safety and took part in cycling activities. Children were also given free bike helmets as a part of the American Academy of Pediatrics "Put a Lid on It" campaign.




SPIRIT OF AMERICA BOATING CAMP

The Lorain County Metro Parks partnered with Spirit of America to offer a boating education camp for kids entering 8th grade. Participants learned safe boating skills and became a "captain of their own vessel" by riding

in and operating s a i l b o a t s, powerboats, jet skis, canoes, kayaks and standup p a d d l e b o a r d s. This camp also gave students the opportunity to earn a state boating certificate.



SPLASH ZONE UPGRADES





This past year, Splash Zone in Oberlin saw quite a few renovations and also added an outdoor Dog Park on the property. The Dog Park, located adjacent to the parking lot, is almost a full acre in size and is divided into a small dog area and a large dog area. Among the renovations to the inside of Splash Zone are brand new floors.

LORAIN COUNTY METRO PARKS PROGRAMS

In 2014, the Lorain County Metro Parks' naturalist staff conducted 360 requested programs (those programs requested by outside groups) and 1,468 public programs (those listed in the ARROWHEAD, the District's newsletter) with nearly 150,000 people in attendance.




